It was announced that Patricia Espinosa, Michael Bloomberg, Anand Mahindra, Chairman Mahindra Group, will cochair the summit. Valériane, as a representative of the faith-based groups, attended the summit briefing. She made the point that it is most difficult to change the mindsets of people and that is one of the reasons why the negotiations are not progressing as they need to. Prior to the COP 21 in Paris and the COP 22 in Morocco, the summit of conscience addressed this from a spiritual, religious and human science point of view. The California Summit could probably benefit from these perspectives and Valériane suggested that Nicolas Hulot, minister of environment for France, should be involved.

Round table discussions

In the "Sustainable Innovation Forum" the business community gathered for a two-day program being held in an award-winning, inflatable tent. It is powered by food waste converted into clean energy. Brahma Kumaris was invited to moderate a round-table discussion on "The challenge of changing mindset". Sister Jayanti and Golo introduced the topic and had a lively discussion with interested participants. Later, Sister Jayanti shared the main points with the whole audience:

- a positive mindset works
- In a fear driven mindset, we take wrong decisions
- Mind is the seed and it is the start of everything
- Where does systemic change actually start?
- It requires courage to go from linear to circular mindset

Visionary Leadership for the Future

Brahma Kumaris organised a public programme in the Rheinisches Landesmuseum. The programme was recognized by the City of Bonn as a special COP23 event. Gopi and Caro warmly welcomed the 40 participants. Thomas Bruhn of the Potsdam Research Institute for Advanced Sustainability Studies moderated the event. His passion is to connect people from the "knowing" scientific community with "caring" people from civil society.



Golo talked about Dadi Janki's (Brahma Kumaris' leader) inspirational and supportive leadership which ultimately led to all the solar installations at the Brahma Kumaris. Anne Barre, founder of Women Engage for a Common Future, talked about the importance of gender equality in tackling climate change. She was amazed by the ignorance of the local knowledge base which could play a vital role in helping local communities.

In her talk, Sister Jayanti highlighted respect and simplicity. When we lose touch with ourselves, there is emptiness inside. Many compensate for this with shopping and over consumption. She said that the foremost quality in a leader is humility and being able to let go of false ego. A genuine humility comes and then it is easy to give respect to others and to the earth. Women can be instruments to bring compassion and love. This is leadership from inside - out. When the pressure from outside increases, the leadership from within needs to be supported by silence.
